Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We have been truly blessed with many who are interested in joining the Catholic Church and, in particular, our parish. This is both a blessing and an opportunity. We have three catechumens who will enter the Church at the Easter Vigil. They will be baptized, confirmed and receive the Eucharist for the first time.

This is the final step in their full initiation into the Catholic faith. This period is called the Period of Purification and Enlightenment and usually coincides with Lent. It began with "The Rite of Election" held at Holy Spirit Catholic Church on the first Saturday of Lent. In the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA) the following is stated: "Both in the liturgy and in the liturgical catechesis, through remembrance of Baptism or preparation for it, and by penitence, Lent renews the community of the faithful together with the elect and disposes them to recall the Paschal Mystery, which the Sacraments of Initiation apply to individuals. In this period, the elect together with the local community give themselves to spiritual recollection, so that they may prepare themselves for the Paschal Feasts and for Initiation by the Sacraments. To this end the Scrutinies, the Rites of Handing On (the First Scrutiny, the Creed, and the Third Scrutiny, the Our Father), and the Rite of Immediate Preparation are provided for them.

The document continues: "The time of purification and enlightenment is given a more intense preparation of spirit and heart, which has the character of recollection rather than of catechesis and is intended to purify hearts and minds by examination of conscience and penitence. This is intended as well to enlighten the minds and hearts of the elect with a deeper knowledge of Christ the Savior. The Scrutinies and Rites of Handing On take place during the Lent that precedes the Sacraments of Initiation.

The "Scrutinies", which are celebrated solemnly on Sundays, have the double purpose mentioned earlier, namely, to relieve what is weak, sick and sinful in the hearts of the elect so that it can be healed; and what is honorable, strong and holy, so that it can be strengthened.

In order to awaken a desire for purification in redemption by Christ, three Scrutinies take place, both to teach the elect gradually about the mystery of sin from which the whole world and every person longs to be rescued in order to be saved from its present and future consequences, and to fill their spirit with the sense of Christ the Redeemer, who is living water (the Gospel of the Samaritan Woman), Light (the Gospel of the Man Born Blind), resurrection and life (the Gospel of the Raising of Lazarus). From the first to the final Scrutiny, they must grow in the awareness of sin and in the desire for salvation."

We celebrate the Scrutinies on the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent at the 8:15 a.m. Mass. Please keep our three catechumens (Sung, Amber and Paige) in your prayers as they prepare to enter the Church at the Easter Vigil.

We also have several candidates who have already been baptized and will enter the church during the Easter Season.

I hope you are finding this Lenten Season a time of reflection, prayer and growth. You are in my prayers each day. May God bless you with the best.
