Dear Brothers and Sisters:

Today I would like to share a meditation with you from *The Word Among Us: Daily Meditations for Catholics*. The meditation is taken from Tuesday, July 29, the Memorial of Saints Martha, Mary and Lazarus. The readings for that day were: *Exodus 33:7-11; 34: 5b-9, 28/Psalm 103: 6-13/John 11:19-27*.



"Martha . . . went to meet him." (John 11:20)

Today's feast celebrates the family — Martha, Mary and Lazarus - who were united in their devotion to Jesus. But that doesn't mean their relationships were picture-perfect. They had very different personalities, and like any family, they had times when they let their differences divide them. But Jesus worked through these differences to form each of them into the disciple he wanted them to be. And that's a good reason to celebrate them!

Take Martha. The first time we meet her and her sister in the Gospels, she is annoyed that, instead of helping with hostess duties, Mary is just sitting at Jesus' feet and listening to him (*Luke 10:38-42*). Yet in today's reading - which takes place right after her brother, Lazarus, has died - Martha rushes out to meet Jesus as soon as she hears he has come (*John 11:20*). Would she have been as eager to leave the mourners had she not come to understand that Mary's devotion to Jesus was "the better part (*Luke 10:42*)?

That's the blessing of family life! Each person influences everyone else with their unique gifts and personalities. God can use even our differences to smooth out our rough edges. Martha would not have been the woman she was without her siblings. The same goes for Mary and Lazarus. Their lives, even when they rubbed each other the wrong way, were intertwined. When they opened their home to Jesus, they shared the good and the bad with him, and even their conflicts brought them closer to the Lord.

When you look at your own family, things may not seem quite so saintly. Don't lose heart! The Lord knows we all have relationship difficulties at times. We have all experienced grief or pain in our families. But on today's feast, ask Jesus how he wants these relationships to make you the person he wants you to be. Invite him to be present in your family. Ask him to reveal himself through each member of your family as he draws all of you closer to himself.

"Jesus, help me treasure my family. Come, Lord, and make us holy!"

I hope you have a blessed day and a blessed start to the new school year. You are in my daily thoughts and prayers.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

PARISH REGISTRATION: If you attend Mass regularly at St. Joseph, you should be registered here. Single adults who no longer share an address with their parents should have their own separate registration. If you are planning to be married or are newly married, you are invited to join the parish. As a general rule, registration with a particular parish is important for any sacrament, such as baptism, First Communion, Confirmation, marriage and becoming a godparent. Please call the parish office if you have questions.

BAPTISM: Baptismal preparation class is required for parents and godparents. We offer the class at the beginning of each quarter, or four times a year. Please call the parish office to register. If you are a godparent from another parish, you must provide a letter of good standing from your pastor.

MARRIAGE: Marriage preparation classes are required if you plan to be married at St. Joseph. The preparation time is six months. You must be registered in the parish, complete the marriage preparation classes, attend an Engaged Encounter day or weekend and supply all the necessary documentation.

FUNERAL: Please call the parish office before making arrangements with a funeral home to ensure that the church and pastor are available. Schedule an appointment with the pastor to plan the service.

REMINDER: When there is a holiday (religious or federal) and the parish office is closed, there will be no meetings in the RE Center, St. Francis Hall or the church. Any scheduled or standing meetings that fall on such a holiday must be moved to a different day. Please call the parish office with questions or to reschedule.
