Dear Brothers and Sisters:

As we begin another new month, I'm amazed at how fast time goes. Today I want to share a meditation with you from The Word Among Us: Daily Meditations for Catholics from Saturday, September 27, the Feast of St. John Vianny. The readings for that day were: Zechariah 2:5-9, 14-15/(Psalm) Jeremiah 31:10-1/Luke 9:43-45.

Pay attention. (Luke 9:44)

Most of us look at the night sky and see a lot of stars and maybe a constellation or two, but an astronomer sees much more. It's not because he has sharper eyes, but because he has learned how to pay attention to the position of the stars and the smallest of details that we tend to overlook.

In the Gospel, Jesus urges his disciples to pay attention as well while he explains what is going to happen to him: he will be arrested and crucified.

Even today, Jesus is still asking us to pay attention to him. But how?

Be quiet. There is something about quiet places that can help us slow down and focus. This may mean getting up a few minutes before everyone else so you can be with the Lord. It may mean taking a walk outside and enjoying the quiet. Surrounded by the beauty of creation, you can ask the Lord what is on his heart.

Be still. Quiet physical spaces are important, but it's not always possible to find one. Even so, we can practice stilling our thoughts and turning to the Lord. For example, try pausing for a moment every time you get a drink of water, and see if you can sense God's presence. He may fill you with peace or bring a Scripture verse to mind. Don't be discouraged if you don't always hear something. It's about practicing and learning to be still, not about getting it right every time.

Be simple. Part of paying attention may mean simplifying your life a bit or putting the other aspects of your life in proper perspective. Simplicity and focus are the keys to developing the sharp eyes of an astronomer. They can help us see in the "bunch of stars" in our lives the patterns that reveal the beautiful constellations of grace that Jesus is offering us.

Quiet. Stillness. Simplicity. Try putting these into practice. Jesus wants to teach you how to hear his voice and discern his will. The more you practice paying attention, the more you will discover his hand guiding you closer to him.

"Lord, help me to focus on you today."

I hope you have a blessed day. You are in my daily thoughts and prayers.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

PARISH REGISTRATION: If you attend Mass regularly at St. Joseph, you should be registered here. Single adults who no longer share an address with their parents should have their own separate registration. If you are planning to be married or are newly married, you are invited to join the parish. As a general rule, registration with a particular parish is important for any sacrament, such as baptism, First Communion, Confirmation, marriage and becoming a godparent. Please call the parish office if you have questions.

BAPTISM: Baptismal preparation class is required for parents and godparents. We offer the class at the beginning of each quarter, or four times a year. Please call the parish office to register. If you are a godparent from another parish, you must provide a letter of good standing from your pastor.

MARRIAGE: Marriage preparation classes are required if you plan to be married at St. Joseph. The preparation time is six months. You must be registered in the parish, complete the marriage preparation classes, attend an Engaged Encounter day or weekend and supply all the necessary documentation.

FUNERAL: Please call the parish office before making arrangements with a funeral home to ensure that the church and pastor are available. Schedule an appointment with the pastor to plan the service.

REMINDER: When there is a holiday (religious or federal) and the parish office is closed, there will be no meetings in the RE Center, St. Francis Hall or the church. Any scheduled or standing meetings that fall on such a holiday must be moved to a different day. Please call the parish office with questions or to reschedule.
