Dear Brothers and Sisters:

For those of you who had a Fall Break, I hope it was a great time full of fun and family. This past weekend, we had the gift of Robert Black brewing his famous coffees. Also this weekend, we had the Knights of Peter Claver and the Ladies of Auxiliary sponsor hospitality after the 11:15 a.m. Mass. They join the 5:00 pm hospitality team of Ben and Karen Sundey and Sabine Wlodarski, and the 8:15 a.m. hospitality sponsored by the Knights of Colombus. Everyone who came had a wonderful time sharing food and fellowship. I appreciate each group's outreach.

A common compliment from people who come to visit us for Mass on the weekends is that this parish is very welcoming and friendly. That is the gift of St. Joseph parish community.

Several years ago, I read a book entitled *The Prayer of Jabez*. I believe that the parish St. Joseph parish family has incorporated the ideal of being a place where all are welcome. This week is Part 1 or a 2 Part reflection. I hope you read and enjoy.

The Prayer of Jabez: A Cry for God's Blessing

The **Prayer of Jabez** is a short but powerful passage found in the Old Testament, tucked within a genealogy list that many readers might be tempted to skip. Yet, this small prayer stands out as a shining example of faith, boldness, and trust in God's ability to bless beyond measure.

1 Chronicles 4:10 — "Jabez called on the God of Israel, saying, 'Oh, that You would bless me indeed, and enlarge my territory, that Your hand would be with me, and that You would keep me from evil, that I may not cause pain!' So, God granted him what he requested."

Who was Jabez?

Jabez was a man mentioned briefly in the genealogies of Judah. His mother named him *Jabez*, which means "pain" or "sorrow," because she bore him in suffering. Despite the negative meaning attached to his name, Jabez rose above it. Instead of allowing his identity to be shaped by pain, he turned to God in prayer. His name became a testimony — not of pain, but of God's power to transform a life through faith and prayer.

The Four Parts of Jabez's Prayer

The prayer of Jabez is made up of four heartfelt requests. Each one teaches something timeless about how we can pray today.

Part of Prayer	Meaning	Application for Today
"Bless me indeed"	Jabez asked for God's favor and abundance.	We can boldly ask for spiritual and practical blessings, trusting God knows best
"Enlarge my territory"	Not just land, but influence, opportunity and responsibility	Pray for God to expand your ability to serve, help and reach others.
"That Your hand would be with me"	Jabez desired God's guidance and protection.	Invite God to guide every decision and keep His presence close.
"Keep me from evil"	He wanted to live free from sin and harm.	Pray for strength to resist temptation and walk in holiness.

You are in my thoughts and prayers each day. May God continue to bless us with grace, peace and love. Next weekend look for the second part of the reflection.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

PARISH REGISTRATION: If you attend Mass regularly at St. Joseph, you should be registered here. Single adults who no longer share an address with their parents should have their own separate registration. If you are planning to be married or are newly married, you are invited to join the parish. As a general rule, registration with a particular parish is important for any sacrament, such as baptism, First Communion, Confirmation, marriage and becoming a godparent. Please call the parish office if you have questions.

BAPTISM: Baptismal preparation class is required for parents and godparents. We offer the class at the beginning of each quarter, or four times a year. Please call the parish office to register. If you are a godparent from another parish, you must provide a letter of good standing from your pastor.

MARRIAGE: Marriage preparation classes are required if you plan to be married at St. Joseph. The preparation time is six months. You must be registered in the parish, complete the marriage preparation classes, attend an Engaged Encounter day or weekend and supply all the necessary documentation.

FUNERAL: Please call the parish office before making arrangements with a funeral home to ensure that the church and pastor are available. Schedule an appointment with the pastor to plan the service.

REMINDER: When there is a holiday (religious or federal) and the parish office is closed, there will be no meetings in the RE Center, St. Francis Hall or the church. Any scheduled or standing meetings that fall on such a holiday must be moved to a different day. Please call the parish office with questions or to reschedule.
