Dear Brothers and Sisters:

Monday, October 20, was the feast of St. Paul of the Cross. The readings for that day were: St. Paul's Letter to the Romans 4:20-25/(Psalm) Luke 1: 69-75/The Gospel According to Saint Luke 12:13-21. The reflection for the day came from the Loose-Leaf Lectionary for Mass from Liturgical Press.



Delving into family ancestry is quite common today. Whole companies and television series have been dedicated to helping people discover their roots and gain better understanding of their heritage. The longing to maintain strong connections with our ancestors is what Paul is writing about in this excerpt from his letter to the Romans.

He reminds us that we are descendants of Abraham, our father in faith, and Abraham's legacy of belief in God. God's promise is one on which we continue to rely even to this day. With such a faith legacy behind us, we might also consider how the legacy will continue through and after us.

We have inherited many good things - a creed that has withstood heresy and schism, a worshipping community, a papal line of succession and at church to call home. How often do we consider our own participation in this inheritance?

Ask yourself: How am I contributing to the belief system, the community, the institutional church? Do I consider my contribution sufficient as long as I put my envelope in the collection basket each week, or might I choose to make my legacy one of bold profession of faith, deep investment in my church community and active engagement with the teachings of the church? Are these our treasures that we pass on to the next generation? If not, what is the legacy we are handing on?

Let's take time to reflect on these questions. We are today's disciples and apostles who are entrusted with sharing the faith. But in order to share the faith, we need to be immersed in the faith. The first step is to attend and participate in Sunday Mass every week and Holy Days of Obligation. There are two very important and special times during the celebration of Mass. The Mass is divided into two major parts, the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The first part includes the Scripture readings, especially the Gospel, and the second part is the Consecration/Communion. During those times we need to be focused on what is happening. It is not a time to get up and a get a drink of water or go to the rest room. It is time to be filled with awe and gratitude for all that God has done for us.

I hope that you have a blessed week. You are in my thoughts and prayers each day.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

PARISH REGISTRATION: If you attend Mass regularly at St. Joseph, you should be registered here. Single adults who no longer share an address with their parents should have their own separate registration. If you are planning to be married or are newly married, you are invited to join the parish. As a general rule, registration with a particular parish is important for any sacrament, such as baptism, First Communion, Confirmation, marriage and becoming a godparent. Please call the parish office if you have questions.

BAPTISM: Baptismal preparation class is required for parents and godparents. We offer the class at the beginning of each quarter, or four times a year. Please call the parish office to register. If you are a godparent from another parish, you must provide a letter of good standing from your pastor.

MARRIAGE: Marriage preparation classes are required if you plan to be married at St. Joseph. The preparation time is six months. You must be registered in the parish, complete the marriage preparation classes, attend an Engaged Encounter day or weekend and supply all the necessary documentation.

FUNERAL: Please call the parish office before making arrangements with a funeral home to ensure that the church and pastor are available. Schedule an appointment with the pastor to plan the service.

REMINDER: When there is a holiday (religious or federal) and the parish office is closed, there will be no meetings in the RE Center, St. Francis Hall or the church. Any scheduled or standing meetings that fall on such a holiday must be moved to a different day. Please call the parish office with questions or to reschedule.
