

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

For all inquiries, please call Maritza Holland at the parish office. For sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation, there must be at least one year of formation immediately prior to the preparation for the sacraments.

BAPTISM. Parents and godparents must attend a baptism preparation session before scheduling a baptism.

MARRIAGE. If you intend to be married at St. Joseph Church, you must be registered in the parish and be active by donating your time, talent or treasure in support of parish projects. Regular Mass attendance on Sunday and on Holy Days of Obligation is also required. Couples planning marriage should contact the parish before setting a wedding date.

OCIA. Adults and children of catechetical age are welcomed into the Church through a process called the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA).

Dear Brothers and Sisters:



I hope and pray you are all doing well.

In the latest issue of *The Word Among Us: Daily Meditations* for January 1 – February 17, 2026 there was a wonderful reflection for Wednesday, January 21. The readings for that day were: **1 Samuel 17:32-33, 37, 40-51/Psalm 144:1-2, 9-10/Mark 3:1-6**. Perhaps you can take a little time today to read and reflect.

Today the Lord shall deliver you into my hand. (1 Samuel 17:46)

Wouldn't it be wonderful to throw a rock at your problems and watch them all disappear? That's what David did: he chuckle his stone at Goliath, and the dreaded giant collapsed.

But there is more to this story than David's bravery. As his words to Goliath show, David relied on the Lord to give him victory. How else could one small stone make such a big difference?

God wants us to learn this combination of faith and action that David showed, that cooperation between God's grace and our work that can lead us into victory. David's words, "Today the Lord should deliver you into my hand," show how much he placed his confidence in the Lord (**1 Samuel 17:46**). But even as he spoke these words of defiant faith, he picked up a stone, took aim, and fired a deadly shot. Try to imagine what would have happened if David had merely boasted in the Lord but had not done anything. It could have been tragic!

How often do we think that relying on God means being passive, and therefore neglect the work that he calls us to do? On the other hand, how often do we rely on our own strength, doing the "work of the Lord" but neglecting the "Lord of the work"? Both approaches are risky. The first one can leave us feeling fruitless and frustrated. The second one can leave us either full of ourselves or worn-out and dispirited. But the middle way - the way of cooperation between divine grace and human work - brings not only fruitfulness but refreshment and joy as well.

It's a challenging combination. We need to humble ourselves and recognize that we are weak without the Lord. But we also need to believe that we can do all things through Christ who strengthens us. We need to learn the art of being still and knowing that he is God, and we also need to learn how to step out of the boat and onto the surging waters of life.

What Goliath are you facing right now? How can you step out in faith, trusting in God's power as you fling your stone?

Jesus, I embrace the victory you have given me on the cross. I place my confidence in your power and in the talents you have given me.

You are in my thoughts and prayers each day. Take care and be safe.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

PARISH REGISTRATION: If you attend Mass regularly at St. Joseph, you should be registered here. Single adults who no longer share an address with their parents should have their own separate registration. If you are planning to be married or are newly married, you are invited to join the parish. As a general rule, registration with a particular parish is important for any sacrament, such as baptism, 1st Communion, Confirmation, marriage and becoming a godparent. Please call the parish office if you have questions.

BAPTISM: Baptismal preparation class is required for parents and godparents. We offer the class four times a year, at the beginning of each quarter. Please call the parish office to register. If you are a godparent from another parish, you must provide a letter of good standing from your pastor.

MARRIAGE: Marriage preparation classes are required if you plan to be married at St. Joseph. The preparation time is six months. You must be registered in the parish, complete the marriage preparation classes, attend an Engaged Encounter day or weekend and supply all the necessary documentation.

FUNERAL: Please call the parish office before making arrangements with a funeral home to ensure that the church and pastor are available. Schedule an appointment with the pastor to plan the service.
