FROM THE



PASTOR

I. CHURCH COMMUNITY

- A. **Ekklesia**: being called out from. The Church is the community that has been called out of the fallen world into a new way of being.
- B. Linked with the universal Church in the same ritual
- C. Stepping into heaven and the communion of saints

II. ENTRANCE PROCESSION

- A. Singing
 - 1. Echo of celestial song
 - 2. Reflects the harmony of God
- B. Priest acts **"in persona Christi capitis"**: in the person of Christ, the head
- C. Incense: invokes the heavenly court

III. INTRODUCTORY PRAYERS

- A. Sign of the Cross
 - 1. Spoken and traced on our bodies
 - 2. We are claimed people, branded through Baptism, so we belong to Christ
 - 3. Amen as a sign of personal commitment and acceptance
- B. Greeting: Priest greets people as the sacramental head
 - 1. People respond, "and with your spirit," acknowledging the priest's role during the Mass as *in persona Christi*
- C. Penitential Act
 - 1. We acknowledge our sins
 - 2. We ask God for mercy (*Kyrie Eleison*)
- D. Gloria
 - 1. Burst of joy for the forgiveness of our sins
 - 2. Giving "glory to God in the highest" produces peace here below
- E. Collect
 - 1. Collecting or gathering the strands of prayers that have been introduced at this point
 - 2. Content of the Collect: praise God; remember some great work of God; and ask with confidence that he might do something great for us now (anticipates the Eucharist)
 - 3. Always directed to the Father through the Son and in the Holy Spirit

Here are two questions to think about and share this week:

- 1. How do you mentally and spiritually prepare for Mass before your arrival and when you are waiting for Mass to begin?
- 2. How do you react to mystery? Are you "patient within the unknowing?" Why or Why not?

I want to thank all those who have responded to the Lenten Appeal – the Sister Joan Fund. Please feel free to continue to contribute to that Fund. I also want to thank all those who participated in the Blood Drive last Sunday. I hope that you have a blessed day and week. You are daily in my thoughts and prayers.
