

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

For all inquiries, please call Carmen Amato at the parish office. For sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation, there must be at least one year of formation immediately prior to the preparation for the sacraments.

BAPTISM. Parents and godparents must attend a baptism preparation session before scheduling a baptism.

MARRIAGE. If you intend to be married at St. Joseph Church, you must be registered in the parish and be active by donating your time, talent or treasure in support of parish projects. Regular Mass attendance on Sunday and on Holy Days of Obligation is also required. Couples planning marriage should contact the parish before setting a wedding date.

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

On Monday, we celebrated Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday. It was also the start of the annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, and the week of the Inauguration of the 46th President and Vice-President of the United States.

At Monday morning's Mass, I shared how Jesus was not trying to upset anyone by breaking with the practice of rigorous fasting but rather "the message of Jesus is that the new message he is preaching needs a new mentality to receive it. He came to tell us we need a new mindset. His message cannot be contained within the old ways of understanding God and what God expects. This call for newness is still valid for the church today. We cannot put new ways of being church into old structures." (*Loose Leaf Lectionary – Monday, January 18, 2021*) In other words, let's make room for new ideas. God is doing something new. I continued by sharing just a few well-known quotes from Dr. King's *I Have A Dream* speech that he gave 58 years ago. The words have just as much meaning today.

"I say to you today, my friends, so even though we face the difficulties of today and tomorrow, I still have a dream.

It is a dream deeply rooted in the American dream.

I have a dream that one day this nation will rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed, 'We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal.'

I have a dream that one day, every valley shall be exalted, and every hill and mountain shall be made low. The rough places will be plain, and the crooked places will be made straight, 'and the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together.'"

Then in the reflection on **Mark 2:18-22** from the *Word Among Us*, the focus was on the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity saying, "God has been doing something new in the body of Christ: he has been drawing together divided churches and helping them overcome painful, centuries-old prejudices. Catholics, Lutherans, and Methodists have come to agreement on the term 'justification by faith.' Orthodox and Catholics are talking together about the role of the pope. Even Catholics and Evangelicals are putting aside their suspicions and working together to promote a culture of life. SO much is changing, and God is inviting us to embrace these changes as part of His plan.

"As Christians, we may still disagree on doctrines like the papacy and the role of Mary. But we all agree on so many more: a loving, Trinitarian God; salvation in Christ; the gift of the Holy Spirit; the call to conversion and baptism, and the promise of heaven. Instead of emphasizing what divides us, let's focus on what we have in common.

"All this week, as people from different churches pray together, let's ask the Lord to soften our hearts and open us up to this new path of greater unity."

Let us pray that this openness will extend to all people, regardless of their race, nationality, religion, gender or political persuasion.

You are always in my daily thoughts and prayers. May God bless you with the best today and every day.

DECREE EXTENDING THE DISPENSATION DUE TO COVID-19 In accordance with canons 87 § 1 and 90 of the Code of Canon Law, I make the following provision, recognizing that infection rates for COVID-19 remain generally high in the territory of the Diocese of Birmingham in Alabama and that the dispensation I previously extended on November 22, 2020 shall soon expire, on January 10, 2021:

I hereby extend the dispensation from the obligation to assist at Holy Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation through Sunday, March 14, 2021 (inclusive) – the 4th Sunday of Lent (Lætare Sunday) – for all the Roman Catholic faithful who reside or are visiting and present in the Diocese of Birmingham in Alabama.

In the last extension, I encouraged everyone to evaluate the risks they take and return to church, if they have not already, and if it was prudent to do so. I know that many heeded my request and that our parishes had and are still having wonderful Christmas celebrations.

In the meantime, a spike in cases of COVID-19 in Alabama has continued. Though my teaching remains unchanged and I again warmly encourage all to benefit from corporate worship in our parishes while taking the indicated precautions from health authorities (social distancing, wearing of masks, sanitizing hands), I also judge that it is best to extend the dispensation at the present time.
