For all inquiries, please call Carmen Amato at the parish office. For sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation, there must be at least one year of formation immediately prior to the preparation for the sacraments.

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

**"There are a variety of gifts, but the same Spirit and there are a variety of services but the same Lord; and there are a variety of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone."** (1 Cor 12: 4-6)

It is with great joy that on Wednesday, July 21, we open the Year of Thanksgiving for the Beatification of beloved Founder of the Salvatorians, Father Francis Mary of the Cross Jordan. His life and holiness are a model for us as we follow the Savior. In this moment of prayer, we want to enter into communion with the Salvatorian Family to give thanks to the good God for the gift of the Charism granted to our Blessed Spiritual Father, for the benefit of the whole Church and of all humankind. Father Jordan wanted to bring people of all vocations and from all parts of the world together so that united they would know and proclaim Jesus as the Savior of the world. On this day we are the fruit of his work and of all those who have preceded us in faithfully living out this call.

Reflection on the Salvatorian Family Charter – Part 1 of 2

**"Therefore, work closely together to exercise the apostolate of announcing Christ so that *lumen luceat*, "the light may shine."** (Jordan Talks, February 1, 1901)

Let us briefly recall the history that led to where we are today. Beginning with the first intuitions and writings in which Fr. Francis Jordan seeks to describe a plan for his work, we find the dream of an apostolic movement that involved several vocations, professions, as well as different forms of dedication and time to engage in the purpose of the project. We know that, historically this plan did not materialize, however, the spiritual gift and missionary mandate expressed above, especially in **John 17:3**, did in fact survive and transcend the practical and canonical issues that arose.

With the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council, the Church formally recognized the wealth of Apostolic Charisms that gave rise to many congregations and missionary works in the 19th century. It called on all of them to make a return trip to their founding origins. That's when we Salvatorians rediscovered documents, spiritual writings, letters and sketches of Father Jordan's plans. These contained the passionate dream of the young man, John Baptist Jordan, our spiritual father. One entire generation of Salvatorians (members of the Society and of the Congregation) then went to great lengths to bring to light these original writings with hopes to re-found the two existing congregations, based on these original sources. They sought to clarify and experience the true Salvatorian identity. In addition, they sought to re-found the lay movement that for diverse historical reasons had been left along the wayside before the Council. This search for Salvatorian identity continues today because each individual and each generation needs to be imbued with the charism and embrace it in the reality of its own day-to-day living.

Therefore, we open this Year of Thanksgiving, first with gratitude to God for reconstituting us as a "family", in which diverse vocations and personal gifts come together to live the same spirituality and mission. This is truly a service to the Church and to all of humankind. In 2002, the General Chapters of the Congregation and Society decided to take on the important task which would involve all Salvatorians from all three branches, to formulate a Charter that defines the Common Salvatorian Identity, Mission and Spirituality of us all. This participatory process lasted five years and culminated in the drafting of the "Charter of the Salvatorian Family".

Look for the conclusion of this article in next week's bulletin. In the meantime, may God watch over each of you. You are in my daily thoughts and prayers.
