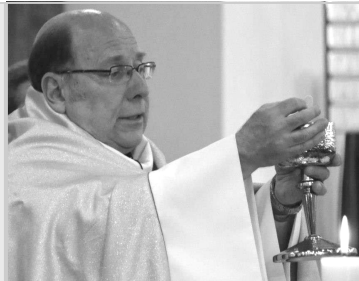

For all inquiries, please call Carmen Amato at the parish office. For sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation, there must be at least one year of formation immediately prior to the preparation for the sacraments.

**BAPTISM.** Parents and godparents must attend a baptism preparation session before scheduling a baptism.

**MARRIAGE.** If you intend to be married at St. Joseph Church, you must be registered in the parish and be active by donating your time, talent or treasure in support of parish projects. Dear Brothers and Sisters:

This week we conclude with the article I began last week on the occasion of the Feast Day of Blessed Francis Mary of the Cross Jordan on Wednesday, July 21.

**Reflection on the Salvatorian Family Charter – Part 2 of 2**

**“Therefore, work closely together to exercise the apostolate of announcing Christ so that *lumen luceat*, “the light may shine.” (*Jordan Talks, February 1, 1901*)**

During this period, the Lay Salvatorians officially became the International Community of the Divine Savior (ICDS). To carry out a long-term plan to develop a common declaration that reflected the global involvement of all the members, a team was formed with representatives of the three branches to coordinate a participatory process, formulate a method and schedule the work. As a result, in 2006, a well-developed draft of the Salvatorian Family Charter was presented to the Chapters of the Society and the Congregation and to the General Assembly of ICDS. Each group was able to offer amendments and eventually give their provisional (ad experimentum) approval to the text of the Charter. During the next six years, the Charter was experienced and implemented locally by all Salvatorians. Finally, in the 2012 General Chapters and General Assembly, the Charter of the Salvatorian Family was approved. From that time onward, it has become a document that declares who we are. It states that our common mission, spirituality, and charism are experienced by all Salvatorians in all three branches of the Salvatorian Family.

Following this approval, the International Charism Commission prepared texts and celebrations for the deepening of the contents of the Charter. These are available online on international web pages and in books that some units have published in their own languages. That important material can be revisited and savored again by all Units.

However more than just letters and texts, the Charter requires your experience, because, as already stated, the Charter has its roots in the original intuition of our Founder, Fr. Francis Jordan, who wanted to involve many people in his apostolic plan. “Priests of all Catholic rites and lay people, who, having left all like the holy Apostles, ‘behold we have left all and followed you,’ devote themselves totally and in every possible way through the spoken and written word, and above all also in schools and seminaries for the indigenous in their own lands, as professors, doctors, teachers, preachers, writers, printers, catechists, etc., wherever the greater glory of God will call for it. For women, there are sisters who, being joined by similar statutes, educate the girls.” (*Smyrna Document, 1880*)

Therefore, the mission of “knowing the living and true God and his Son Jesus Christ” and of making Him known and loved by following the example of the Apostles is a life plan whose goal is personal sanctification that must be expressed communally in apostolic actions. Our Founder strongly insisted that his spiritual sons and daughters must zealously live their vocation and mission “by all the means compatible with our calling in life, eagerly attend to your own salvation and to that of your neighbor.” (*Jordan Talks February 5, 1897*). Our thanksgiving for the beatification of Fr. Francisco Jordan begins, therefore, by recalling gratefully the memory of our collaboration as a Salvatorian Family in our Unit and wherever we live.

May God watch over each of you. You are in my daily thoughts and prayers.
