For all inquiries, please call Carmen Amato at the parish office. For sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation, there must be at least one year of formation immediately prior to the preparation for the sacraments.

Dear Brothers and Sisters:



This weekend, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ – Corpus Christi. It is also the kick-off of a three-year “grassroots revival of devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.” The mission is to renew the Church by kindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. Particularly now, the bishops of *The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops – USCCB* feel that the Church in the United States needs healing, unity, formation and sending.

Bishop Raica has extended an invitation to the faithful of the diocese to take part in the local revival kick-off at the Cathedral of St. Paul this weekend. A 40-hour devotion began on June 17 and will culminate with a Eucharistic procession through the streets of downtown Birmingham this Sunday, June 19, the Feast of Corpus Christi, at 7:00 p.m. Please keep this revival in your prayers.

Because we will be focusing on “Eucharistic Revival: My Flesh for the Life of the World,” there have been questions about when we might begin offering the Precious Blood at Mass. The following memorandum came from the Office of Sacred Liturgy at the diocese.

“Bishop Raica has granted permission to return to the practice of offering the Precious Blood of the Lord at Mass at the discretion of each local pastor or administrator. Within the Diocese of Birmingham, there may still be a variety of different COVID situations. Therefore, each pastor/administrator may make the decision whether or not to reinstate the offering of the Precious Blood.

“This time provides an opportunity to review with Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion the proper procedures which should take place. We encourage all ministers to refamiliarize themselves with the procedures for distributing the Precious Blood, including proper wiping and turning of the chalice. The diocesan guidelines may be found on the Office of Sacred Liturgy website.

“Please note that the practice of intinction as referenced in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (**#284-287**) and the Norms for the Distribution and Reception of Holy Communion Under Both Kinds in the Dioceses of the United States of America (**#49-50**), is reserved only to the priest.

“We also remind the faithful that where the opportunity for the reception of the Precious Blood from the chalice does exist, it is always available to those who desire to receive in this way only as an option. The act of receiving Holy Communion is an act of faith. The person makes this act of faith in the total presence of the Lord, whether receiving Holy Communion under one form or under both kinds, according to Norms for the Distribution of Holy Communion Under Both Kinds (**#14-15**).

“The Catholic Doctrine of Concomitance holds that when receiving Holy Communion, we receive the whole Christ, body, blood, soul and divinity, under the form of bread alone. (**CCC 1390**)”

Our parish Spiritual Life Committee here at St. Joseph has discussed this matter, and is planning to offer the Precious Blood at Mass in the future, perhaps at the beginning of the new Church year at Advent.

You are in my daily thoughts and prayers. May God keep you safe today and every day.

CAMPUS LANDSCAPE UPDATE As you may have noticed, the parish has embarked on two landscaping projects in recent weeks. The first is a garden across from the Columbarium under the large pine trees. It was designed by Harvey Cotton, a garden writer and designer who was also the chief horticulturist at the Huntsville Botanical Garden until his retirement. The garden has a variety of plants for year-round interest and a sprinkler system with landscape lighting. It will be completed in the fall with the planting of two red bud trees at the west end of the space and placement of benches. There will also be a grotto, which is still in the design stage and will be done at a later date.

The second garden will be behind the parish office building, and is in the design stage. A designer has been selected and an initial design meeting will be held in mid-June. This garden will contain an arbor with a statue, benches and landscaping.

We want to thank Harvey Cotton, Jackson Fite of Fite Construction, Greg Thrower and his team from Empire Landscaping, and the many volunteers for all their hard work and expertise.

Both gardens, which will be officially named later, are part of the 25-year master plan that was done in 2000 for St. Joseph Church and Holy Family School. To date, we have

completed the Messmer Center, the new Storage Building, the new church, the renovation of St. Francis Hall, the Columbarium and, coming soon, Phase 1 of the new Holy Family School.
