For all inquiries, please call Carmen Amato at the parish office. For sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation, there must be at least one year of formation immediately prior to the preparation for the sacraments.

A LETTER FROM THE DIOCESAN SUPERINTENDENT OF CATHOLIC SCHOOLS



Dear Parishioners:

As we begin this school year with joy and enthusiasm, I have exciting news to share.

Our Diocese of Birmingham Catholic Schools across northern and central Alabama have been re-accredited by Cognia, a global, nonprofit improvement organization which provides accreditation and professional services to more than 36,000 schools in 85 countries. The Cognia Accreditation Process uses rigorous, research-based standards to examine whole school systems — the program, the cultural context, and the community of stakeholders — to determine how well the parts work together to meet the needs of learners.

In April 2022, a Cognia team of experts reviewed evidence and interviewed pastors, parents, teachers, principals, school staff, students, Chancery leadership and diocesan and local school advisory council members. A few key results from the team’s report include:

- Overall performance. The Index of Education Quality (IEQ) for the diocese was scored at 334 points out of a possible 400, up considerably from our 2015 score of 281 and exceeding the current national average of 281. Our IEQ indicates that our schools are engaged in impactful practices that are sustained over time and becoming engrained in our schools’ institutional culture.
- Commendation of increased unity. A common mission statement and the recently completed diocesan Strategic Plan for Catholic Education support increasing system-wide unity. The report stated, “The Diocese of Birmingham (diocese) school system has a strong belief in its mission statement. Stakeholder interviews shared that Catholic Schools of the Diocese of Birmingham provide an excellent educational experience in the Catholic tradition, enabling all students to develop their God-given talents.”
- Commitment to a high-quality education for all of its students. Interviews from all stakeholder groups—teachers, students, school leaders, parents, and advisory councils— indicated focus and support for students to achieve academically while immersed in Catholic beliefs, practices, and traditions.

Please join me – and the Cognia team -- in commending our Diocese of Birmingham Catholic schools for consistently improving student learning, creating a sense of community, and preparing students for their future through mission-focused, innovative programs. May God guide us throughout this 2022-23 school year in inspiring and enriching the lives of our students as they grow spiritually, intellectually, and physically.
