Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We have just begun Advent 2022, a new Church year. Let us hope and pray that this year will be filled with joy, peace and grace for all peoples. Saturday, November 26 ended one Church year to give way to another. During the last days of the old year, we focused on Revelations. There



was a wonderful reflection and reminder on November 25 in *the WORD among us: Daily Meditations for Catholics*. The readings for the day were as follows: *Revelation* 20: 1-4,11-21: 2; *Psalm 84: 3-6, 8*; *Luke 21: 29-33*.

"I saw a new heaven and a new earth." (Revelation 21:1)

The closing chapters of the Book of Revelation are filled with visions of the chaos and conflict that will accompany the final judgment when Jesus returns. But today's excerpt concludes with a vision of hope: a new heaven and a new earth (*Revelation 21:1*). In the end, God's perfect love will triumph. Every evil will be conquered and every wrong made right. Our Lord will bring in a whole new creation. And God *"will dwell with . . . his people" forever (21:3)*.

This is our hope! One day we will live forever with our Father in heaven. But we don't need to wait until Jesus returns to be close to God. Today's psalm response reminds us, "Here God lives among his people" (see *Revelation 21:3*). Right here. Right now. In our fallen world. Even while our lives are still a mixture of the new creation and our sinfulness. Even today, God dwells with his people. And he will never leave.

Jesus is Emmanuel, God with us, even while we wait for his Second Coming. So how does God dwell with us now , and how can we experience it?

First, God dwells with us through the Holy Spirit. When we were baptized, the Spirit took up residence within us. He is always at work within us to move our hearts to pray and read God's word. He is there to strengthen us in times of temptation. And he is there to remind us that we're never alone.

Second, God dwells with us in the sacraments. Whenever we go to Confession, he embraces and cleanses us of our sins. Every time we receive the Eucharist, he enters our bodies and fills us with his immeasurable grace.

Finally, God dwells with us in ordinary human interactions. He reveals his faithful love to us through our families. He demonstrates his closeness through the kindness of a friend who listens to our worries. And he shows us his mercy when someone forgives us for having sinned against them.

One day, we will see God face-to-face in the new heaven and earth. But until that day, God mercifully lives among us. Right here. Right now.

"Thank you, Lord, that you are with me."

I wish each of you a happy Advent Season, a season of preparation. May it be filled with many blessings and graces. You are in my thoughts and prayers each day.
