Dear Brothers and Sisters:

For the next few weeks, I will share information about the Eucharistic Revival that began in our diocese last year on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, *The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.* The following is taken from the Parish Playbook.

The three-year Eucharistic Revival has begun! The Church in the United States is responding to the bishops' call for us to be healed, converted, formed and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist, and then sent out on mission "for the life of the world" (*John 6:51*). We are invited to deepen our relationship with Jesus Christ, Our Lord, through the celebration of the Eucharist, so that we can be set on fire for the mission our Church needs so desperately.

The Eucharist is the greatest gift that Jesus has given us because it contains his very self. At the Last Supper Jesus says to his Twelve Apostles, "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (*John 15:13*). Then he makes that statement real in the gift of the Eucharist when he says, "This is my Body given up for you... this is my Blood poured out for you" (*Luke 22:19–20*). He gives this saving self-gift—his Paschal Mystery—an enduring presence in the Eucharist, so that for all ages we would be able to receive this gift and learn to make a gift of our own lives: laving down our life for him, as he did for us.

On the Solemnity of Corpus Christi this year, June 11, 2023, we will begin the Eucharistic Revival's parish year (June 2023–July 2024). This year promises to be the most impactful phase of this multi-year response to the Holy Spirit. For the Eucharistic Revival to be successful, parishes must fulfill their key role in boldly proclaiming the Gospel. With Pope Francis, we must understand that "the parish is not an outdated institution; precisely because it possesses great flexibility, it can assume quite different contours depending on the openness and missionary creativity of the pastor and the community" (Evangelii Gaudium, no. 28).

This playbook is organized into four invitations for pastors and parish leaders to implement in their parishes. All the initiatives are focused on reaching those who have some connection to the Church but have not yet encountered Christ in the Eucharist. Parishes can use this manual to strengthen their Eucharistic culture and share the gift of the Eucharist with all people, regardless of where they are on their faith journey.

Please note that the following suggestions are designed primarily for pastors and parish leaders. Please visit our website, *eucharisticrevival.org*, for resources throughout the Revival.

This year, let us make the Holy Father's prayer for parishes our own: Let us be daring. Let us all rethink the style of our parochial communities. We pray that parishes, placing communion at the center, may increasingly become communities of faith, fraternity and welcome towards those most in need. (*Pope Francis, Prayer Intention for February 2023*).

May Our Lady of Guadalupe, Blessed Carlo Acutis, and St. Manuel González García intercede on behalf of our response, and may our Eucharistic Lord rekindle the fire of missionary zeal in us all!
