For all inquiries, please call Carmen Amato at the parish office. For sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation, there must be at least one year of formation immediately prior to the preparation for the sacraments.

BAPTISM. Parents and godparents must attend a baptism preparation session before scheduling a baptism.

MARRIAGE. If you intend to be married at St. Joseph Church, you must be registered in the parish and be active by donating your time, talent or treasure in support of parish projects. Regular Mass attendance on Sunday and on Holy Days of Obligation is also required. Couples planning marriage should contact the parish before setting a wedding date.

Dear Brothers and Sisters:



This letter has several purposes – a thank you, an invitation and an update.

First, I want to thank the many volunteers who spent many hours helping to make the Treasures of the World sale such a tremendous success. I especially want to thank Tammy Hoskins, who has coordinated this giant effort for the past two years. It was a well-planned event with many moving parts. I appreciate the young and seasoned parishioners who rolled up their sleeves and worked so hard. This was a true team effort. I would have like to list all the names, but I'm afraid I would forget someone.

The St. Joseph Joyful Workers helped to organize this event, along with volunteers from the Knights of Columbus, Knights of Peter Claver and the Ladies Auxiliary, St. Joseph Boy Scout Troup, students from UAH, students from St. John Paul II Catholic High School and many more.

On Tuesday, a group of helpers from the different organizations helped to fill the St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Store truck with the leftovers, those treasures that were not sold. So, we continue to pass the gifts forward.

Second, on another note, St. Joseph Parish has a great need for volunteers to help with several ministries. Religious Education: RE teachers (catechists) and subs. Liturgical Ministries: altar servers, choir members, courtesy team members, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, lectors and ushers. Our parishioners have changing schedules and commitments, and we are relying on a smaller number of people to fulfill these ministries. Without additional help, we may have to adapt by reducing some ministries.

Third, the Holy Family School building project is coming along. The projected date of completion is November 2024. Please remember that this is Phase I of a three-phase project. This new section has ten classrooms, four intervention rooms, a clinic, two teacher work rooms, bathrooms and storage rooms. The Pre-K and Kindergarten rooms also double as a storm shelter. I want to thank all of you for your generous support. However, we need to continue this project to build administrative offices, a library, music, art and science labs and a cafeteria. So, I ask you to continue to help us with your time, talent and treasure to make this dream a reality. If you have pledged in the past and have completed your pledge, consider making another. If you have not yet pledged, consider doing so. We are building for the present and the future. As St. Paul says, "we have begun the race, now let us finish it."

Thank you for all you do to make our parish a welcoming and caring oasis in this sometimes crazy and mixed-up world.

I hope you had a wonderful Fourth of July holiday with family and friends. You are always in my thoughts and prayers. May God keep you safe from all harm.
