SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

For all inquiries, please call Maritza Holland at the parish office. For sacraments of First Reconciliation. First Communion and Confirmation, there must be at least one year of formation immediately prior to the preparation for the sacraments.

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

The writer of the *Letter to the Hebrews* states: "we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses." As I was reflecting on this passage, I thought about all the wonderful men and women saints – St. Francis, St. Claire, St. Maximilian Kolbe, the Blessed Mother and the apostles.

I also thought about a priest I met when I was ministering in the Diocese of Nashville. It so happened that on Wednesday, August 7, he was featured in *Give Us This Day* – *Blessed Among Us* section. His name is Fr. Charles Strobel (1943-2023), founder of "Room in The Inn."

Charles Strobel was born and raised in Nashville. Following high school, he studied for the priesthood and was ordained in 1970. One of the strongest influences of seminary, he later said, was his reflection on the Sermon on the Mount, beginning with Christ's words, "Blessed are the poor." He would refer to what he called Beatitude Moments – "grace-filled occurrences in life that exist to us of our faith lived out on a daily basis."

Those moments occurred in 1985 while he was serving as pastor of a parish in East Nashville. On a bitterly cold night, he looked out the window and saw homeless people huddled in their cars. The parish had acquired an empty shop next door, and Fr. Strobel opened the doors and invited the homeless in. "I knew I wanted them to come back." This was the genesis of the Room in The Inn, an ecumenical effort that within two years had received support from 31 congregations to provide food and shelter to the homeless. Ultimately, that number grew to 200 congregations.

Room in The Inn became a full-time ministry. At the time of his death on August 6, 2023, Fr. Strobel was widely regarded as "the civic conscience" of Nashville.

"I've described the program as a sanctuary from the violence of the streets, or an Ellis Island for urban refugees, or a Red Cross tent in a war zone, or an oasis in an asphalt desert, or a gathering of friends, or a rewriting of the original no-room-in-the-inn story. The important image I use now is the notion of a communion meal."

I hope you have one or more in your present or past that are part of a cloud of witnesses that surround you. They give us strength and encouragement. I wish you a blessed week. You are always in my thoughts and prayers.

DID YOU KNOW?

Sometimes, we can get too comfortable at Mass. There are two times during the Sacrifice of the Mass when we should keep our minds, bodies and souls focused. The Liturgy of the Word (especially the readings and homily) and the Liturgy of the Eucharist (the Consecration). Unless there is a real emergency, these are the times that we should not get up to go to the bathroom or answer a cell phone call. These are the two most sacred times and they should have our full attention.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

PARISH REGISTRATION: If you attend Mass regularly at St. Joseph, you should be registered here. Single adults who no longer share an address with their parents should have their own separate registration. If you are planning to be married or are newly married, you are invited to join the parish. As a general rule, registration with a particular parish is important for any sacrament, such as baptism, 1st Communion, Confirmation, marriage and becoming a godparent. Please call the parish office if you have questions.

BAPTISM: Baptismal preparation class is required for parents and godparents. We offer the class at the beginning of each quarter, or four times a year. Please call the parish office to register. If you are a godparent from another parish, you must provide a letter of good standing from your pastor.

MARRIAGE: Marriage preparation classes are required if you plan to be married at St. Joseph. The preparation time is six months. You must be registered in the parish, complete the marriage preparation classes, attend an Engaged Encounter day or weekend and supply all the necessary documentation.

FUNERAL: Please call the parish office before making arrangements with a funeral home to ensure that the church and pastor are available. Schedule an appointment with the pastor to plan the service.
