

Several people have asked me what was the most memorable experience on the trip?

Each day had its moments. However, I have to be honest – it was the daily Masses we

celebrated in various places, two in Greece and two in Turkey: sometimes in the hotel,

sometimes at an archeological site (our first Mass was celebrated outside among the ruins of Corinth) and sometimes in churches.

We saw many amazing things: walking — or I should say climbing — to the Acropolis, walking in the ruins of ancient city of Troy, visiting Mary's house in Ephesus, visiting the Hagia Sophia (mosque/museum) with beautiful mosaics that were done when Hagia Sophia was a church and the Blue Mosque where you needed to take your shoes off. In Turkey, we saw the seven churches from the Acts of the Apostles (Ephesus, Smyrna - modern Izmir, Pergamum, Thyatira, Sardis, Philadelphia, and Laodicea — Hierapolis [Pamukkale]).

It was worth the time, effort and energy to experience these moments with our parish family. Even though the entire parish did not make the trip, I assure you that we took each of you with us in our hearts.

We were blessed with two extraordinary tour guides who treated us like family, looking out for our enjoyment and safety. Evie was our guide in Greece and Saba was our guide in Turkey. We had incredible tour bus drivers who got us in and out of every place we visited – especially the tight ones with very narrow roads.

And yes, we took lots and lots of pictures. We will try to put together some kind of a photo presentation to share.

I hope all those who had the opportunity for the "Fall Break" had a marvelous time with family and friends. I also hope that you are enjoying the fall season. You are in my daily thoughts and prayers.


