For all inquiries, please call Maritza Holland at the parish office. For sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation, there must be at least one year of formation immediately prior to the preparation for the sacraments.

The following reflection comes from the October issue of *Give Us This Day: Daily Prayer for Today's Catholic*. It was from Monday, October 14.



Our Stories of Repentance and Grace by Marilyn McEntyre

Marilyn McEntyre is author of numerous books on language and faith, including Caring for Words in a Culture of Lies and Make a List: How a Simple Practice Can Change Our Lives and Open Our Hearts.

One of the many purposes of reading Scripture is to wander among its stories of human confusion, loss, discovery and triumph, and see in all of them how the Spirit of God broods over the waters, how God speaks in dreams, calls the unlikeliest people and sends angels in disguise.

Scripture reminds us repeatedly that we are, none of us, in a position to judge ourselves any more than we're in a position to judge others. We make the moral decisions required of us with the best guidance available - or sometimes we betray ourselves and others and do what we know is wrong. But even those betrayals may open a back door somewhere for the Spirit to enter and renew us with an invigorating forgiveness that plants seeds of change.

King David failed spectacularly and often in the course of a turbulent life whose passions included avid devotion to the Lord and profound repentance for deep sins. Peter made a fair number of consequential mistakes on his way to becoming one of God's most powerful instruments.

The best lives are riddled with ambiguities and lined with shadows. Each of them is a story about grace. To tell our own stories as stories about grace rather than stories about success or failure is to tell them more truly. That truth can set us free.

I hope you have a wonderful week filled with many blessings and joys. You are in my daily thoughts and prayers.

NEW ST. JOSEPH NURSERY SERVICE We are happy to offer a nursery for your child during our Sunday morning services, so that you can enjoy and fully worship during the Mass. As a courtesy to our volunteers and other parents, we ask that you observe the following rules.

Children must be one to four years old. ONLY a parent may DROP OFF AND PICK UP the child. (no siblings). Parents must sign their child in and out, and leave a phone number in case we need to contact you. Please keep your phone on silent during Mass, but have it near by.

No food or drinks are allowed in the nursery to prevent any allergic reactions. If your child requires a bottle during this time, it must be prepared and ready.

If your child is potty training, we ask that you take them to the restroom before coming to the nursery, or please have your child in a pull-up. If you child is still in diapers, please provide extra diapers and wipes. We will have a separate sanitized area to change diapers.

A volunteer can take children to the restroom when needed, but we cannot accompany your child into the stall.

Nursery volunteers will have their phone number available at drop off in case you need to pick your child up early. Drop-off and pick-up are at the entrance to the Holy Family School gym.

Drop off: 8:00 a.m.-8:15 a.m., or the first 10 children

11:00 a.m.-11:15 a.m., or the first 10 children

Pick up: 9:30 a.m.-9:45 a.m. and 12:30 p.m.-12:45 p.m.

Please pick your child up right after the end of Mass. We ask that you not leave Mass early to pick up your child, except for an emergency.


