Dear Brothers and Sisters:

This meditation was for Tuesday, November 19 and comes from *The Loose Leaf Lectionary for Mass Nov. 1, 2024 – Jan. 31, 2025.* The readings for that day were: *Revelation 3:1-6, 14-22/Psalm 15: 2-3a, 3bc-4ab, 5/Luke 19-1-10.*



We are about to begin a new Liturgical Year as we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent next weekend. I thought that this meditation would be good for all of us to take the time to reflect and make ourselves ready for the many blessings and graces God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit want to shower on us.

Reflection

Today we hear the Word, "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, then I will enter his house and dine with him, and he with me." (*Revelation 3:20*). To our surprise, Jesus called the sinner – Zacchaeus - to open his door and dine with him. Zacchaeus was the tax-collector known for his dishonest practices, a man burdened by his sins and societal judgment. Yet, when Jesus called him by name and expressed his intention to visit his home, Zacchaeus responded with joy. He didn't let his past mistakes define or keep him from the transformative encounter with Jesus. Instead, he eagerly opened the door of his heart to the Savior.

In our lives, our "door" symbolizes the entry point to our innermost selves - the core of our being where our thoughts, feelings, and desires reside. Jesus invites us to open this door to him, to welcome him into the depths of our being. Rather than serving as a barrier, our sins should become the very reason we open our door with humility and repentance. It is an acknowledging our need for a Savior that we create a space for the joy of salvation to enter.

So, where is our door? It is in the vulnerability of our repentance, the sincerity of our prayers, and the openness of our hearts to receive God's mercy. Our door is wherever we acknowledge our need for Jesus, inviting him into the messiness and brokenness of our lives. It is in the moments of reflection, prayer, and reconciliation that we find the door creaking open, allowing the loving presence of Jesus to enter and transform us from within.

I hope you have a wonderful week filled with many blessings and joys, and that you enjoy the Thanksgiving holiday with family and friends. You are in my daily thoughts and prayers.
