Dear Brothers and Sisters:

I wish each of you a very happy and blessed new year – the first Sunday of Advent is the beginning of the Church's liturgical new year.



This meditation came from the November issue of *Give Us This Day: Daily Prayer for Today's Catholic* and it is very appropriate for this time. It was written by Fr. Lawrence E. Mick, a priest in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati and a writer and consultant on the liturgy and sacraments.

On November 25 (Monday of the Thirty-Fourth Week in Ordinary Time) the readings of the day were: *Revelation 14:1-3, 4b-5/Responsorial Psalm 24:1bc-2, 3-4ab, 5-6/Luke 21:1-4*.

Our Ticket Home

Understanding the Book of Revelation can be challenging. What do John's strange visions really mean? Yet, we should not dismiss them too quickly. Today's vision depicts 140,000 saints in heaven. That number is meant to suggest a perfect assembly (12 times 12 times 1,000). The actual number of those saved is much larger, of course, but the vision might prompt us to wonder how we can be included in that gathering. The Gospel points the way. Jesus commends the poor widow because she "offered her whole livelihood" to God. The point is not her monetary gift; it was only a pittance, like a couple of pennies tossed in the collection basket by a toddler at Mass. But it signified her gift of herself to God. She held nothing back. She trusted in God's Providence to provide for her future.

Her act of surrender, of trusting her life to God, challenges each of us. How much do we trust God's care for us? How much are we willing to risk based on God's promises to us? How completely are we willing to give ourselves to God? We should remember, too, that our love for God is expressed by our love for our brothers and sisters. How generous are we toward those in need?

We may never match this unnamed widow's total commitment (maybe on our deathbed), but she stands as a reminder of God's call to abandon ourselves, to leap into the arms of our loving God without holding back.

I hope that this little reflection will help each of us as we begin a brand new Liturgical Church Year. Let us work together to make this the best year possible full of grace, peace and joy.
