#### SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

For all inquiries, please call Maritza Holland at the parish office. For sacraments of First Reconciliation. First Communion and Confirmation, there must be at least one year of formation immediately prior to the preparation for the sacraments.

BAPTISM. Parents and godparents must attend a baptism preparation session before scheduling a baptism.

MARRIAGE. If you intend to be married at St. Joseph Church, you must be registered in the parish and be active by donating your time, talent or treasure in support of parish projects. Regular Mass attendance on Sunday and on Holy Days of Obligation is also required. Couples planning marriage should contact the parish before setting a wedding date.

OCIA. Adults and children of catechetical age are welcomed into the Church through a process called the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA).

#### Dear Brothers and Sisters:



As we begin a new calendar year, I wanted to share the following with you. There is talk in the Diocese about beginning a second Deaconate class. Here are some things to think about if you are interested.

### **General Criteria for Diaconate Formation Applicants**

Listed below are the Permanent Diaconate Admission Requirements in the Diocese of Birmingham for admission to the formation program. Please read these carefully and contact the Director of Formation, Permanent Diaconate Program if you have any questions.

- Applicant must be a man in good standing in the Church, and a member of a parish for at least three (3) years. And the applicant must have lived in the geographical boundaries of the Dio cese of Birmingham in Alabama for at least five (5) years, prior to application.
- If a convert, must be a Catholic for five (5) years.
- Applicant must have endorsement and support of his Pastor.
- Applicant must be at least 31 years of age; and no more than 55 years of age on the date the aspirant year begins.
- Applicant must have a stable employment record and a fiscally sound financial history. Appliant must successfully pass a financial background check.
- Applicant must be without a criminal record.
- Applicant must be free of canonical impediments or irregularities.
- Applicant must possess a minimum of a high school diploma from a school within the United States, or country of origin (Grade 12 or equivalent), or a certificate of GED completion.
- Applicant must be able to read, write and speak some English upon entrance into the formation program as determined by pastor recommendation. Applicant must clearly demonstrate progress in English language communication each academic year within the formation program.
- If married, applicant must have evidence of a stable and growing marriage relationship. And the applicant must be in a valid marriage as recognized by the Roman Catholic Church. His spouse must be willing to support her husband actively through formation and in his ministry.
- Married men must be married at least five (5) years and living examples of the Sacrament. The applicant's wife must be living within the same household along with applicant.
- Married men with young children must not deprive their children of adequate quality time with their father, nor place an undue burden on their wives.
- Single men must be committed to a life of celibacy subsequent to ordination. He must show that he has led a life of celibacy for at least seven (7) years, prior to application.
- If widowed, applicant must have been widowed for at least three (3) years, and living a celibate life, prior to application.
- The applicant must show leadership qualities and possess a history of active participation in pastoral ministry in his parish.
- The applicant must show that he has the faith and compassion to live the Beatitudes.
- •The applicant must be in good physical and psychological health and free of any chronic condition that may interfere with, or be aggravated by his participation in, the formation program and ministry, if ordained.
- •The applicant must have a positive attitude towards the Church and be flexible in adapting to the future needs of the Church.
- The applicant must have a prayerful disposition.
- The applicant must be able to work collaboratively with men and women of all races and ethnicities
