

Campus Modernization - Phase 3 Update Corner April 2022



Welcome to our Monthly Update on the progress towards Phase 3 of our Campus Modernization undertaking. You may ask "What is Campus Modernization and what is Phase 3?"

"Campus Modernization" is a plan that was presented to the Bishop for the Diocese of Birmingham in which St Joseph Catholic Community proposed the building of a new church (completed in 2010) as Phase 1; the re-purposing of the old church that is now Saint Francis Hall (completed in 2014 to 2015) as Phase 2; and replacing the school building for Holy Family School as the final phase, Phase 3.

Progress to the Future – a Timeline

Thru March 2022: Chapman-Sisson (architectural firm) final stages of building plans development

APRIL 2022:

- Chapman-Sisson submitting plans to Huntsville City for ~30 day review, a necessary step to secure building permits

What is our History?

In 1954, two years after the Church was founded, parents in the community wanted a school where their children would be educated in a robust learning environment. A tradition that continues today.

Why a Mission School? As a natural progression of the Salvatorian outreach mission, the school was established. It provided a variety of services and amenities to the community.

FAST FACT: THE <u>first</u> school in the State of Alabama to be integrated - - not by law but by parental determined request. This was reverse integration as white parents solicited admission to the traditionally black mission school.
